Unfortunately, there are only a couple of classes who have reached our school, and Local Authority target of 96%. Well done to those classes!

We are experiencing a real problem with lateness at school. Children are welcomed into school between 8.45am—8.55am. If children arrive after this time, they are recorded as late .Since the start of this academic year we have lost 2640 minutes of learning to children being late. That equates to 44 hours, which is over 6 and half school days!! This is something we are monitoring closely in school and we will be in touch with Parents/ Carers to arrange meetings if your child's punctuality is a concern.

The closing date for primary applications for September 2024 is 23:59 on 15 January 2024.

Secondary school admissions: If your child is in Year 6 you can now apply for their secondary school place at: www.lancashire.gov.uk/schools

It's quick and easy to do and you will receive email confirmation of your application.

You must apply even if you already have siblings in school. If you live in Lancashire you can include out of area preferences on your online application

The closing date for secondary applications for September 2024 is 23:59 on 31 October 2023.
