<u>Our Celebration Assemblies are back</u> ... and they are an absolute joy! So lovely to hear teachers speaking so positively about what they are doing in class. It is also great for our younger children to see what older children are doing and for our older children to have an actual chance to set an example. Brilliant!

<u>Attendance!</u>

In an effort to get back into good attendance habits, I'm going to let you know how we are doing attendance-wise on a weekly basis for a few weeks. We know good attendance habits help our children's learning so last week our overall attendance figure was 86%. This week has improved to 90.5% however, this is still below where it should be! <u>Self-Isolation Q&A</u>

We just wanted to answer two of our most frequently asked COVID questions at the moment:

Q: Can my child still come to school if they have been a close contact or live with a positive case? A: Yes, as long as they do not have any COVID19 symptoms they do not need to self-isolate because they are under 18 years and 6 months. But we and the Government strongly advise that they take a daily Lateral Flow test for 7 days.

Q: When can my child come back to school after testing positive for COVID19? A: Either after 10 days or following two consecutive negative lateral flow tests, which have been taken 24 hours apart with the first one taken no sooner than 5 days into their self-isolation.

Extra Jubilee Closing Day

In celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, schools have been given an extra school closure to use within this academic year. In order to get the maximum benefit for pupils and create the least amount of inconvenience to parents, we have agreed that this day will be on Monday 6th June 2022. Therefore, the summer half term will Monday 30th May until Monday 6th June and school will reopen on Tuesday 7th June 2022.

Our Spring Bulbs

Please encourage your toddlers to stick to the paths around school as our spring bulbs are trying to emerge. Nature is wonderful but fragile too especially when easily trampled shoots try to compete with heavy footfall. We are encouraging our children in school to be very aware of our environment so please join us in allowing our springtime display to show itself off at its best!
