Speech Therapy Top Tips These apply to all children and parents and here's Tip No. 2 today.

(Louise's) Top Tips for supporting your child's language development: Understanding words ... not.

Our children often find it difficult to understand all the words in a sentence.

Sometimes children can find it difficult to understand the negative e.g. don't or not.

This means if you say: "Don't stand on the chair"... some children hear: 'Stand on the chair'.

It is best to say what you want your child to do, rather than what you don't want them to do.

So saying, "Stand on the floor" is easier to understand and it's more positive too.
