## Intent

- To involve musical ambassadors within the monitoring of the music curriculum, using knowledge organisers and personalised curriculums.
- To ensure a wide variety of pupils receive the same opportunity to attend any extra-curricular music clubs.
- To ensure musical passports are regularly updated within classrooms and used for children to reflect and enjoy their musical experiences.
